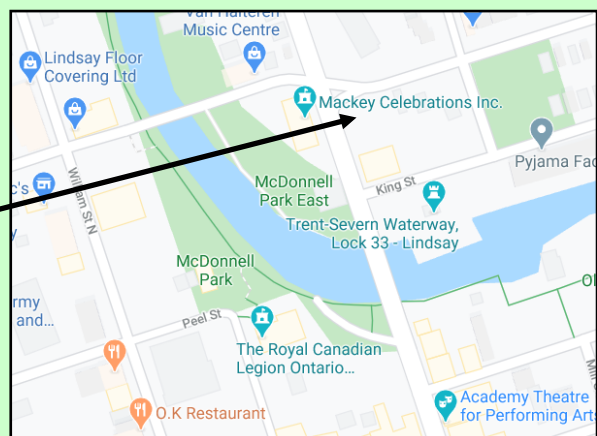

STONEY LAKE -- The Kawartha Spirit will no longer ply local waters as the cruise boat service is ceasing operations immediately, its captain announced Saturday.

Randy Hinton shared news the boat, which has served the region for 26 years, on the Stoney Lake Boat Cruises website and Facebook pages.

"It is an unusual gift to be able to make your living doing something you truly love along side your family and friends," Hinton wrote.

The Kawartha Spirit will be moved to the east coast to continue service. It has been moored at the Mt. Julian Viamede Rd. public dock on Stoney Lake adjacent to the Viamede Resort since 2014.

Before that, the 200-passenger capacity vessel launched for years from Fenelon Falls and Bobcaygeon, where Hinton lives with his wife Susanne.

Those who provided the service enjoyed being part of weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, fundraisers, fall colour cruises, vacations and other special events, he stated.
