Overlooking the Wutai Shan Buddhist Garden is the main Dharma Hall which has been under construction since 2011.

The entire property spans more than 530 acres. The site is one of four purchased by the Buddhist Association of Canada Cham Shan Temple.

The plan is to develop four temples that mimic the sacred temples in China. The temples will take decades to build, as they are funded only by donations.

The Buddhist Association of Canada Cham Shan Temple purchased about 1,700 acres of land years ago for this purpose. The Wutai Shan Temple on Ski Hill Road is the first to be built and the remaining three are planned for Manvers Township.

Buddhism is not a religion but a way of life, and people of all faiths are welcome to visit the temple for meditation and solitude.

Built of wood, the construction uses an ancient technique, a dying art, that uses interlocking brackets with no nails. The process has been used for about 1,000 years.


