A common theme related to the subject, is the need to proceed cautiously ensuring research and study is completed at each stage.

Alan's extensive slide presentation covered his topic in great detail and he very kindly left copies for members to take away for further reading. The audio from Alan's talk is posted on the club's website.

Following his talk, Alan was thanked by Max Radiff who remarked on the difficulty many people have with the subject matter. He also noted that everyone in the room today is now far more knowledgeable about the topic, along with the considerations and choices that are available.

Alan then drew the winning ticket for the Share the Wealth draw and the winner was Jack Fisher. Three additional tickets were drawn with those winners receiving a topical book, Stephanie Green MD, that Alan had kindly donated.

Sal thanked everyone for coming and closed the meeting at 12noon, with 15 members, heading to the Olympia Restaurant for lunch.







Featured Member - John Hunter



John was born in Glasgow in 1933 and his first claim to fame was weighing in at 12lbs 4ozs. During his early years he developed a skill for pencil drawing but was not so good with pen and ink, being a lefty he would tend to smudge his artwork.

At age 11, John passed the entry exam for an excellent high school with an impressive 148/160 (93%) where apart from the academic pursuits he was active in sports such as soccer and tennis, and also joined the choir, chess club and debating society.

After leaving school he worked in an office for a year and decided that it was not for him, so he went to continue his education at Glasgow University and after 4 years graduated with honours in Physiotherapy.

After graduation he worked at Stoke Mandeville hospital, which was the world's leading spinal cord injury institution and subsequently he was offered several high profile posts

including; joining the staff of the British Paralympic Team, becoming a physiotherapist for Glasgow Rangers Football Club, and joining the Ford Motor Co. to set up a physiotherapy program. He did none of these however, and decided to come to Canada.

In order to work in Canada he first had to retake some physiotherapy exams to earn his Provincial accreditation and then he worked at the hospital in Mississauga, before coming to Lindsay a year later. He was asked to set up a physiotherapy program at the Ross Memorial Hospital (RMH) which he did, working on his own for the first 3 years. John was department head at RMH for 31 years and on his retirement the department had 7 physiotherapists and was one of the most highly rated physiotherapy departments in the Province.

John also served as President of the Peterborough Physiotherapy Association and held senior roles in both the Provincial and Federal associations over the years.

Locally, he was a Mason, a Rotarian, and member of the Lindsay Golf Club being President twice. John joined Probus in 2011and his sponsor was founding member Bruce Faulkner.

He and his wife have been married for 63 years and he has 2 daughters and 4 grandchildren.
