Jarret described the history and operations of the CECC and focused on some of the upcoming changes to the internal staff organization and the reasons behind them. Jarrett left a lot of time for Q&A and fielded many questions from Probus members who were very interested in a wide variety matters concerning the CECC itself, as well as, the broader environment in which CECC operates. Dave Robertson thanked Jarret for his time and his talk. Jarret very kindly returned his speaker's fee to the club, with the wish that it be donated to a local charity. The funds will go the Ross Memorial Hospital Foundation, following a suggestion from members present.

Before departing, Jarret drew the Share-the-Wealth ticket, with winner being Bob Armstrong.

Sal opened the business portion of the meeting, drawing members attention to the AGM which is next month. The club's executive and management committee is in place although a Vice-President is needed for the coming year. Sal also asked that if any members wish to join the management committee in any other capacity, that they contact him before the AGM.

More information on the AGM will be published separately and ahead of the meeting, although Sal did mention that there will be a catered lunch following the AGM at Celebrations, that will be funded by the club.

The Central East Corrections Facility is one of nine in Ontario. The facility which was completed in 2002, is a medium/maximum security Provincial Jail and houses up to 1,247 adult male and female offenders in both remanded and sentenced custody.




