lan's talk was entitled "From Ross Rifles to Rubber Tubes: The Life & Legacy of Lindsay's Arsenal" during which he covered the almost 100 year history of the building and site from inception to demolition. Adding background, he talked about politics in 1910's that lead to building a major munitions factory in Lindsay and included many references to recollections of local people who worked there. Ian also presented slides and photo's of the inner workings of the facility at difference times during its history. Following an extensive Q&A Ian was thanked by Bill Mackasey.




Guest Speaker, Ian McKechnie was born and raised in Lindsay, earned his Honours Bachelor of Arts in English Literature from Trent University in 2013, and his Certificate in Museum Studies from the Ontario Museum Association in 2022.

From 2014 through 2020, Ian worked as a curatorial associate and project coordinator at the Victoria County Historical Society's Olde Gaol Museum, and from 2020 through 2023, he worked in similar capacities for the Kirkfield & District Historical Society.

Since 2017 Ian has worked as a contributing writer for The Lindsay Advocate magazine, and since July 2023 has served as the magazine's online news editor. In 2021, he published a 206-page book about the history of his mother's family, titled It's All Relative: 170 Years of McQuarrie Memories (a copy is available from the Lindsay Public Library).

He is currently co-editing an anthology of local history titled Reflections on Old Victoria County: A Tribute to R.B. Fleming (scheduled for publication in 2024). In addition to these projects, he is currently editor of Presbyterian History, a newsletter of the Presbyterian Church in Canada's Committee on History, and has contributed two papers to the Canadian Society of Presbyterian History, in 2022 and 2023.



The Lindsay Dominion Arsenal

Dominion Arsenal, the first government cartridge and shell factory and proofing facility, established 1882 at Québec to provide the Canadian Militia with ammunition. A second arsenal was built in Lindsay, Ontario, during WWI, and other plants were built or converted to small arms and artillery-shell production during WWII by the Department of Munitions and Supply. In September 1945 these were brought together as Canadian Arsenals Limited, a crown corporation reporting to the Department of Supply and Services.
